



History of the Land Surrounding Sandwich Mountain Sanctuary



Nevin and Mary Scrimshaw (Norman's parents) moved to the 100 plus acre farm on Sandwich Notch Road several decades ago. As part of their legacy and desire to maintain the integrity and natural beauty of this land, they created an easement with the White Mountain National Forest. Scrimshaw Conservation Land Trust currently oversees the easement and care of its forest, fields and wetlands. This land is a natural resource for exploring forest trails, viewing mountain vistas, enjoying outdoor recreation, community gardens, apple orchards and agricultural activities. Other than the buildings you currently see here, the rest of the land will not be developed and is surrounded by the White Mountain National Forest.
